◆ Prevent and Reduce Underage Drinking

Representatives from Topeka/Shawnee County have joined forces to collaboratively implement Shawnee County's comprehensive community plan for preventing and reducing underage drinking. A 2004 law makes it illegal for people to host an underage drinking party and with a minimal fine of \$1,000.

◆ Character Recognition

Safe Streets, in conjunction with Topeka City of Character, recognizes community Champions of Character who demonstrate good character that significantly improves the health, safety and quality of life in the community.

◆ Cutting for a Cause

Community members cut down tall grass and weeds at abandoned and blighted homes to prevent illegal activity from occurring.

◆ Lock it, Remove it, or Lose it

Topeka/Shawnee County residents are working together to decrease the number of vehicle break-ins throughout Shawnee County. Citizens are reminding everyone to lock the car and remove belongings from the vehicle.

◆ Record It! Report It! Recover It!

Citizens are banding together to increase public awareness of the importance of recording serial numbers of products you buy, reporting the crime if a burglary occurs and assist in the recovery and return of stolen property. A special emphasis will be placed on encouraging citizens to mark their valuables with an Invis ID pen so their property may be recovered if stolen.

◆ Prime Time Play of the Month

Prime Time is designed to promote the various Safe Streets Coalition initiatives through both a speakers bureau and press releases to various media outlets.

◆ Breaking The Cycle

Because there is a high correlation between alcohol and other drug addictions and crime, those arrested for alcohol and other drug crimes are continually revolving in and out of the criminal justice system. Team members will identify interventions, match offenders with positive mentors and community resources in an effort to "break the cycle" of committing crime.
